# Students' Success Stories

### Winning Ideas

Eleven Isha Vidhya students were among 733 winners across Tamil Nadu at the INSPIRE (Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research) Awards – MANAK (Million Minds Augmenting National Aspirations and Knowledge) organized by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. Winning ideas included a medicine QR code scanner, musical dice for the blind and a heartbeat monitor to measure students' mental health.







### Mini Football Champions

The mini football team (in the under-11 age category) of Apollo Isha Vidhya, Argonda, surpassed seven district teams to win a state-level tournament. Ten students in the under-11, 13 and 15 age categories were selected for the nationals. The Mini Football Association (recognized by the School Games Federation of India) sent recommendation letters to five students from the winning team to play at the international level in Yugoslavia.



### **Entrepreneurial Dreams**

Vignesh turned his passion into a profession by founding "Lingam Pets" with the aspiration of becoming an entrepreneur. He studied on a scholarship at Isha Vidhya and credited his accomplishments to the unwavering support and guidance of his teachers, which provided direction for his college journey. Currently running his business from a rented shop with a few pets in his backyard, he aspires to grow into a wholesale pet dealer in Tuticorin.

# Innovative Interventions

Atal Tinkering Laboratories at seven Isha Vidhya schools facilitate hands-on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) learning for Classes 4-12, inculcating a design mindset, computational thinking and adaptive learning

Code Vidhya, starting from Class 4, offers programming and web design skills while strengthening logical reasoning, problem-solving and creative thinking

Power English Classes include a Total Physical Response activity, such as listening to music, reading and acting, for students from Classes 1-4 who need extra support

Learning by Exploring and Presenting for Classes 6-7 enables students to learn to organize their thoughts and express themselves effectively by making PowerPoint presentations

Peer Learning encourages students to communicate confidently before an audience, sharpen critical thinking, narrative skills and impromptu responses

Self-management Spaces where students take full ownership of a project or event while being mentored by their teachers, helping them grow their organizational and leadership skills

Career Day saw 18 guest speakers from professional fields like engineering, medicine and law speak to Classes 9-12 online about career options

# Celebrating Teaching

Happy Classroom Trainings are three-day induction programs to gauge teachers' abilities and impart teaching tools

Methodology Workshops in which subject-specific techniques involving activities, discussion, creative thinking and exploration are demonstrated and practiced

Leadership Programs for principals, vice-principals and a few teachers on time management, situational leadership, team management, sharing feedback and follow-ups

Class Observations and Feedback Sessions in which senior school staff observe a class and discuss improvement areas with the teacher, whose development is monitored and further supported

HERO (Hope Efficacy Resilience Optimism) in which teachers learn about the power of thought and how to overcome difficulties and attend to day-to-day activities joyfully

### **Coaching Students for the Vidyadhan Scholarship Program**

Class 11 and 12 students, as well as alumni, are coached to apply for Vidyadhan, a 5-year scholarship program offered by an independent foundation. It covers graduation expenses for meritorious students from economically disadvantaged families.
